A multi-disciplinary (theatre, dance, poetry and music) approach to arts integration. The ability to facilitate rehearsals, workshops, residencies and devised experiences for students, teachers, teaching artists or any organization and of all ages. Critically acclaimed for creating safe and creative spaces with a mindfulness towards trauma informed practices, inclusion and relatability to historically marginalized populations. Paige identifies as a multi-cultural (Black, Cuban and Chinese) cis-gender woman with a keen eye for language, class and systemic barriers. Paige is an advocate for communities that reflect her own experience as well as LGBTQ+ (specifically Trans), refugees, immigrants, incarcerated, and abused.

SCOPE OF WORK:

As an arts educator, Paige has taught throughout the world, to all ages, in several art disciplines. To date, she has reached more than 10,000 students, from pre-k through college, in several hundred residencies, workshops and performances around the world. She takes great pride in her professional development for educators which include keynote presentations for Disney, The Wharton Center at MSU, The Smith Center in Las Vegas and the Alliance Theatre in Atlanta. She has been recognized in several organizations including the Wolf Trap Institute for Early Learning through the Arts and Arena Stage where she was awarded the Thomas Fichandler award for exceptional promise in theater education. The Huffington Post named Paige a "classroom hero" because of her outstanding arts integration work with STEM initiatives. During the 2020 pandemic, Paige created and produced PAIGE AND FRIENDS a three-episode digital series that focuses on self-care for elementary age students.
